#### RULES OF THE GAME

#### ATTACHED OR GROWING OBJECTS AND THE SURFACE OF THE GROUND

Anywhere on the course, you may not move, bend or break any attached or growing objects, or make any improvement to the surface of the ground (by replacing divots in divot holes, tapping down irregularities of the surface, etc.). Any of these actions would be a loss-of-hole penalty in match play or a two-stroke penalty in stroke play.

Please note, this also includes the putting green. However, players can repair "damage" on the putting green as listed below:

"Damage on the putting green" means any damage caused by any person (including the player) or outside influence, such as:

- Ball marks, shoe damage (such as spike marks), and scrapes or indentations caused by equipment or the flagstick
- Old hole plugs, turf plugs, seams of cut turf and scrapes or indentations from maintenance tools or vehicles.
- · Animal tracks or hoof indentations, and
- Embedded objects (such as a stone, acorn, hail or tee) and indentations caused by them.

**BUT** "damage on the putting green" does <u>NOT</u> include any damage or conditions that result from:

- Normal practices for maintaining the overall condition of the putting green (such as aeration holes and grooves from vertical mowing).
- Irrigation or rain or other natural forces
- Natural surface imperfections (such as weeds or areas of bare, diseased or uneven growth)
- Natural wear of the hole

## 2024 CLUB MEMBER REGISTRATION & RENEWAL REMINDER

Just a reminder that it's time to renew your PMGC membership for 2024. By far the simplest method for renewal is by doing so online, through the <u>Arizona Golf Association</u> (AGA) website. A few clicks can get you renewed, and all paid up for 2024. Your renewal payment includes both club dues as well as your yearly AGA fee. There will be **NO increase** in club dues or AGA fees for 2024. However, payments made *online* will receive a \$5.00 discount versus making payment offline.

Online renewal is strongly encouraged as it streamlines the administrative process for both PMGC and the AGA. However, for those that do not wish to renew online, you may still complete a paper registration form and pay by check, 'offline'. Full details on the renewal/registration process, (including an online renewal "cheatsheet") can be found on the <a href="Membership page">Membership page</a> of our club website.

**NOTE:** Social members may *not renew* online. Social members must <u>download</u> (or pick-up from the PB clubhouse) a paper renewal form.
